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Siskiyou County's Treasurer Announces Auction of 19 Tax-Defaulted Properties on the Internet

Siskiyou County to hold annual tax sale on the Bid4Assets Web site

SILVER SPRING, Md., April 22, 2008 – The Siskiyou County Treasurer-Tax Collector today announced an upcoming public internet auction of 19 tax-defaulted properties starting May 10 – 13, 2008. The counties are divided into two groups: Group 1 – Del Norte, Modoc and Solano counties to be conducted May 3 – 6, 2008 and Group 2 – Lassen, Plumas, Siskiyou and Tuolumne counties to be conducted May 10 – 13, 2008.
